She has a deep interest in contemporary arts generally and particularly black and white photography. That same year, she was named "Victorian Travel Photographer of the Year" by the Australian Institute of Professional Photography and in 2019, she was awarded the title of AIPP Victorian Landscape Photographer of the Year.
